## Strengthening Farmers in Guna

### Enhancing financial inclusion and growth through training & support

This initiative has strengthened financial inclusion and collective growth by enhancing awareness of roles and responsibilities, improving understanding of government schemes, and guiding farmers on accessing credit and institutional resources, thereby promoting sustainable and empowered farming communities.

## Celebrating National Sports Day at Rewari, Haryana







On National Sports Day, students of Govt. School, Jharoda in Rewari, Haryana, actively participated in a range of games and co-curricular activities organized under the LIC Housing Finance Limited HRIDAY project, implemented by End Poverty. Beyond promoting physical fitness and academic engagement, the event served as a platform to create awareness among students and their families about the Project. By involving the broader community in school activities, the initiative fosters stronger community participation, nurturing a sense of ownership and self-driven action.



# Building Climate-Resilient Agriculture under Project Gram Swavalamban, in Tijara, Rajasthan







End Poverty under Project Gram Swavalamban, supported by UBL in Khairthal-Tijara District, Gram Panchayat: Chopanki, Rajasthan has successfully completed Land Laser Levelling and Farm Bunding activities across three villages – Kharkhadi, Khedi, and Hussaipur. The third phase of land laser levelling was completed with active participation from 73 farmers, covering a total of 65 acres of farmland. The initiative has brought remarkable improvements in water-use efficiency and productivity. During the FY24-25 Rabi season, the intervention led to a total irrigation time saving of 601.65 hours and water conservation of 21,659.4 kilo litres, translating to an average 21.5% reduction in both irrigation time and water usage. Beyond saving resources, farmers reported significantly reduced drudgery, labour, and fuel costs. The project also achieved measurable productivity gains, with mustard yields increasing by 8.9% (35 quintals) and wheat yields by 12% (36.8 quintals). These outcomes demonstrate how efficient land management practices like laser levelling and farm bunding are strengthening climate-resilient and sustainable agriculture.



## **Case Study**

### From Homemaker to Changemaker: Manju's Journey of Growth





Once a homemaker from Chandrabhanpura village in Rajasthan, Manju Bairwa dreamed of supporting her family and building a better future. Her journey, however, began with challenges — her family initially did not allow her to step out of the house. Summoning courage, Manju spoke to her family and convinced them to let her join the Shwetdhara Program, implemented by End Poverty and supported by IDFC FIRST Bank, which helps rural women build sustainable livelihoods through dairy development.

Inspired by the program's vision, Manju began her journey as a Gram Sakhi, receiving training in animal husbandry, dairy management, and entrepreneurship. She started modestly by providing animal health input services to women dairy farmers. Her dedication and leadership soon earned her a promotion as a Cluster Coordinator at PVK Boraj in 2023.

In this role, Manju now works across 20 villages, training and strengthening the capacity of around 400 Gram Sakhis and reaching nearly 1,000 farmers, helping them improve their dairy practices and increase their incomes. Alongside her coordination responsibilities, she also contributes to the business growth of the Varini Farmer Producer Company (FPC), promoting collective progress among women farmers.

"Before joining Shwetdhara, I didn't even know the name of the next village. Now, I travel across villages training farmers," says Manju with pride. Her transformation from a homemaker confined to her home to a confident community leader is a powerful example of how courage, learning, and opportunity can open doors to new possibilities and strengthen rural development.
