✓ Agriculture: Set up a Custom Hiring Center, distributed seeds, and promoted organic farming practices.






FICCI Award

Building a Viable Dairy Ecosystem for Dairy Farmers



On December 9, 2024, End Poverty inaugurated a 2,000-litre Bulk Milk Chiller (BMC) at Tapokara in Alwar district, Rajasthan under the Dinker Agriculture Producer Company Limited (DAPCL) project. The ceremony was graced by Mr. Vinod Kaushik, CEO and Founder of End Poverty, and senior leadership team from End Poverty, head office, Gurugram.

DAPCL is already engaged in procurement and marketing of fruits and vegetables in Tijara tehsil, and the addition of milk procurement will further enhance farmers' income. This area had quite a good milk surplus which is mainly procured by middlemen, who doesn't pay competitive prices to the farmers. By initiating milk procurement in the area will ensure fair market price, and round the year access to the organized market.

Strengthening Collaborations for Dairy Development

As part of our DAPCL initiative, we recently inaugurated a 2,000-litre Bulk Milk Chiller in Tapokara, Alwar, to support milk procurement and ensure farmers receive fair prices.

In a step towards progress, End Poverty's founder and CEO - Mr. Vinod Kaushik along with the senior leadership team, visited the Skyrr plant and met with MD, Mr. S.N. Dwivedi, to explore collaborative opportunities and discuss the way forward for supplying high-quality A2 milk.




Success Stories

Laxmi Devi's Journey: from Struggle to Sustainable Livelihood

Laxmi Devi, a landless farmer from Bhagwanpur in Uttar Pradesh, faced significant challenges in supporting her family of seven. With no access to fertile land and limited resources, it was a constant struggle to meet the needs of her family. However, with the integrated support of training in modern agricultural practices, access to a custom hiring center for agricultural tools, and high-quality seeds provided by End Poverty's HRDP Siyana Project in collaboration with HDFC Bank Parivartan, Laxmi was able to generate a stable income.

Through hard work and determination, Laxmi and her family cultivated the land and began selling their produce, turning their













Turning Stubble into Strength

In Shekhpura village, Karnal district of Haryana, stubble burning was a widespread practice among farmers, primarily due to the lack of efficient and affordable methods for managing crop residue. The burning of crop stubble not only caused severe air pollution but also degraded soil quality, reducing agricultural productivity over time. Despite the government's attempts to curb this practice, many farmers, including Virender, struggled with limited access to tools and equipment to manage the large volumes of residue left after harvest.

Virender became a key figure of change when End Poverty's Crop Residue Management initiative introduced sustainable solutions to the village. With access to balers and other equipment through Krishi Yantra Saathi and Custom Hiring Centers, Virender not only adopted the new practices himself but also inspired fellow farmers to join the effort. His leadership and commitment encouraged others to embrace this alternative for crop residue management, paving the way for widespread adoption in the community.

This collective shift helped eliminate stubble burning in Shekhpura by 2023, with incidents dropping to zero. The baled stubble is now repurposed as raw material in industries, creating economic opportunities while improving soil health and reducing pollution. Virender's story is a testament to how one farmer's determination, supported by collaborative and practical solutions, can lead to transformative change for both the environment and the community.
